## Seeking Nominations for the 2019 James J. Morgan Early Career Award Lectureship?

ACS Envr, ES&T, and ES&T Letters are seeking nominations for the 2019 James J. Morgan Early Career Award. For 2019, one early career investigator from Europe, the Middle East or Africa will be awarded. Only authors ten years or less from receipt of their Ph.D. at the deadline for nominations are eligible. Self-nominations are permitted.

Winner will receive an award plaque, USD 2000, and travel expenses up to USD 2500 to attend the 2019 ACS Spring national meeting in Orlando, FL. Nominations should include name, affiliation, and e-mail address of the nominator, nominee's full CV, 2 letters of recommendation, and 3 research articles from the post-Ph.D. period of independent research. Nominations should formatted into this order in one single PDF file. The winners will be announced in September 2018, and the award will be presented at the Orlando meeting. Nominations should be submitted to eic@est.acs.org with a title "Morgan Award Nomination."
